How to Start Your Alert Neighborhood Group

- Visit with as many residents as possible, the more the better!
- Select a person to be the captain for the Alert Neighborhood.
- The captain will contact the Owasso Neighborhood Coordinator to register as a Neighborhood.
- After registration, Owasso Neighborhood Coordinator and captain will schedule a neighborhood-wide meeting that will include a crime prevention presentation by an Owasso Police Officer.
- After the neighborhood meeting, Alert Neighborhood signs can be purchased and installed.
- Schedule annual follow-up meetings.



Remember, the safest neighborhoods are those that encourage the development and implementation of good safety habits.

If something out of the ordinary is observed, you should contact the Owasso Police Department and your Alert Neighborhood Captain.

Crime Prevention Tips To Remember

When you are at home:

- Keep exterior doors and windows locked at all times.
- Keep bushes, trees, and shrubs trimmed back so windows and doors are visible.
- Plant thorny or rough plants in front of windows.
- Install motion sensor exterior lighting at front and back exits or leave outside lights on at night.
- Write down serial numbers of electronics and other items for insurance and recovery purposes.
- Replace screws in hinges of all outside doors with longer screws.

When you are out or on vacation:

- Use timers on inside lights that are visible from the street.
- Close and lock doors between the garage and house.
- DO NOT hide a key outside - give a key to your neighbor or family member along with your contact information.
- Have mail stopped at the Post Office and newspapers picked up by a neighbor.
- Ask neighbors to park in your driveway.
- Ask friends, family members, or neighbors to watch your home.
