The Notice of Intent for the City of Owasso was received on February 1, 2016 and processed by the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). A 30-day public comment period has ended and DEQ hasn't received any comment during the comment period or a request for a public meeting. Enclosed is an authorization allowing you to discharge stormwater from your small MS4 under the terms and conditions of OPDES General Permit OKR04 for stormwater discharges from Phase II MS4 located in Tulsa County.

Your authorization to discharge stormwater shall become effective on March 16, 2017 and expire at midnight on October 31, 2020. Application fee associated with this authorization has been paid. DEQ will send you an invoice regarding the applicable annual fee associated with this authorization. Please conduct an annual review of your SWMP, update it for necessary changes, and submit your next annual report within March 1, 2018.

from Phase II Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System

In compliance with the Oklahoma Pollution Discharge Elimination System (OPDES) Act, 27A O.S. §2-6-201, the Rules of the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), and in reliance on the certified statements and representations heretofore made in its application,

City of Owasso

PO Box 180

Owasso, OK 74055

is authorized to discharge stormwater from a small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) located in Tulsa County at the approximate geographical location: Latitude 36° 15' 49.3", Longitude -95° 51' 19.4".

The receiving bodies of waters are Bird Creek, Elm Creek, Ranch Creek, East Creek, Blackjack Creek, and Owasso Creek.
This facility discharges into a 303(d) listed stream.

The OPDES permit requires permittee to have a Stormwater Management Program (SWMP) which must include appropriate Best Management Practices (BMP) addressing six Minimum Control Measures to reduce pollutants in stormwater to the maximum extent practicable to protect water quality, with implementing BMPs, monitoring, and possible reporting requirements.

All applicable requirements of the Permit are subjected to DEQ inspections and audits.

The SWMP must be available and implemented at your small MS4.

The authorization shall become effective **March 16, 2016** and will expire at midnight October 31, 2020.

All terms and conditions of the OPDES Stormwater General Permit OKR04, as published on November 1, 2015, shall apply to the recipient of this authorization.
